



## **Future Path Medical Honored by Business First as an Innovation Healthcare Hero**

COLUMBUS, July 16, 2010 -- Future Path Medical, LLC, (FPM) a leader in innovation for the automation of clinical fluid monitoring and reporting that assists caregivers with new answers to related regulatory changes, improved working conditions and most of all patient safety, was recently honored by Business First as a Healthcare Hero in the Innovation category.

Freelance writer, Jill McCullough wrote the Business First article in which she outlined Founder Ty Bryant's motivation which has been the driving force behind the innovative technology at Future Path Medical. Ty's inspiration was his son and first business partner, Christopher who was left a quadriplegic following a diving accident in 1997. Ty and his son were frustrated with the methods of urine management and monitoring and set out to invent new approaches and technologies to solve these issues affecting millions of patients. Sadly, Christopher died in 2005 from a blood infection resulting from an overflowing urine bag, a problem that might have been avoided with FPM's innovative technology.

Ty's resolve to bring solutions to patients, grew, he added new proven executives and recently FPM was awarded its first patent on its core technology which is bringing the company to the forefront in providing a cure for the needs of patients and the improvement of healthcare for Quadriplegics who are Spinal Cord Injured and experience incontinency in the U.S. and also internationally. "It is a prime example of our strategy to connect innovative science and technology to patient care. We believe our



technology will soon complete the approval process with the FDA and allow us to begin positively impacting lives,” said **Ty Bryant**, Future Path Medical’s Founder and Chairman.

The company has been awarded one patent and has filed for an additional two patents so far. The breakthrough medical devices from FPM will address caregiver labor productivity and provide early detection of infection, especially urinary tract infections (UTIs) for the many patients who acquire them, including ICU patients where 90% receive Foley Catheters and 70% of those catheterized patients develop UTIs within their first 72 hours of use.

“Further value is derived from the fact that nosocomial infections, including UTIs, are no longer being reimbursed since the October 2008 CMS announcement.” said Ty Bryant, Founder and Chairman. Ty continued “Future Path stands ready to help if the spread of new airborne infections such as MRSA combined with the UTI threat leads to new regulations for the stricter management of catheterized patients.”

Dr. William Pease, professor, chairman and medical director at Ohio State University Medical Center was also quoted in the article saying, “FPM’s efforts have helped make the digital hospital a reality and he commented that he believes OSUMC will be professionally involved in the rollout and testing of the advanced UroSense™ family of products.
